

Trout-lily (*Erythronium* spp.)

Notes:

These two species are commonly known as White Trout-lily and Yellow Trout-lily. Another species of *Erythronium* called Midland Fawnlily (*E. mesochoreum*) has been recorded in Indiana, but it was only in one county. It was found out of its normal range, so it is not included here.

The Trout-lilies are spring bloomers that are enjoyed by wildflower enthusiasts. They grow in colonies on the forest floor before the leaves emerge on the surrounding trees. The leaves of these two species look pretty much the same, but the flowers are different colors.
